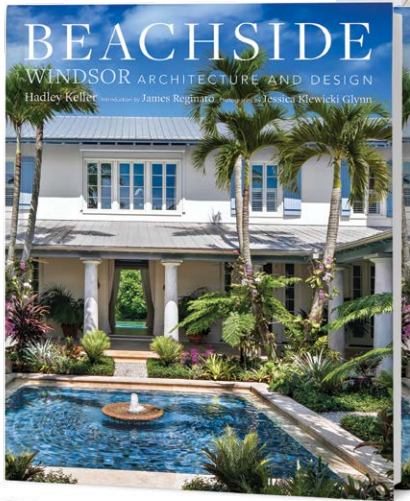


# Beach Chic

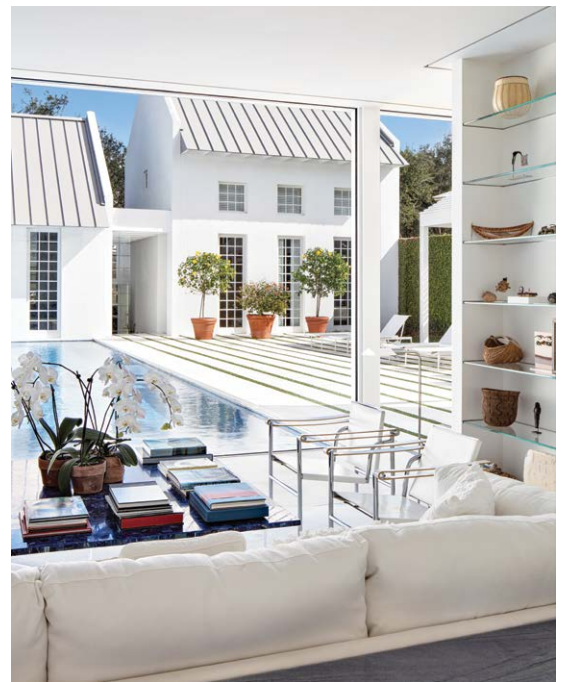
